Description: Mandated requirements for accessibility in Canada and demand from an aging population, is creating a

growing need for barrier-free bathrooms. Today's accessibility compliant bathroom no longer has to be utilitarian or "institutional" in its design. Design options are enhanced through the use of tile and innovative construction methods. The result is beautiful bathrooms that also adhere to accessibility standards for

accessible design.
